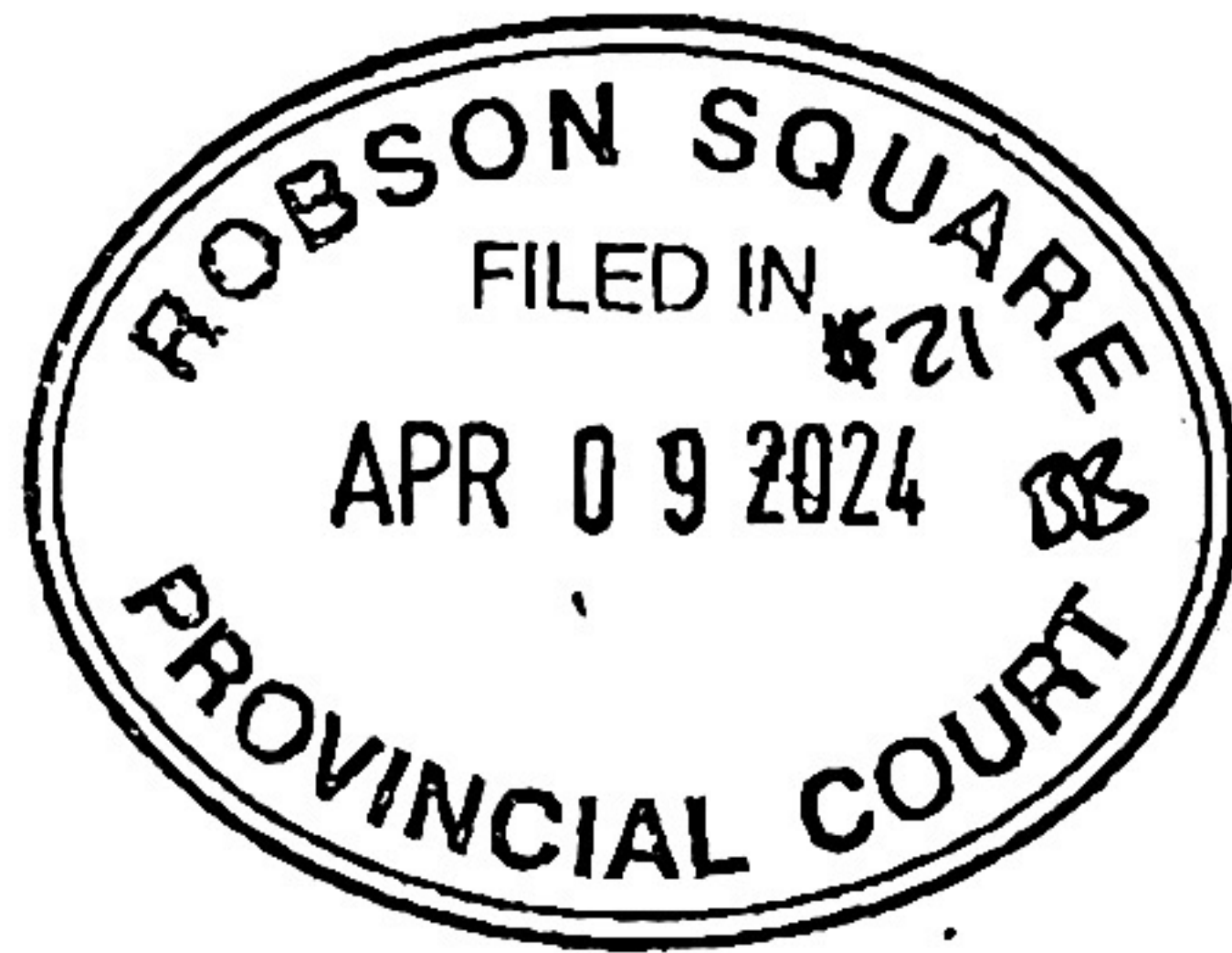

The following order was made by consent and without a hearing by Sherelle Goodwin, Tribunal Member:

This order is in full and final settlement of this dispute.

I order that:

1. The style of cause is amended to ASSADI PRIVATE CAPITAL, INC. v. Sebastian Jean Josef Robillard a.k.a. Sebastien Jean Josef Robilliard.
2. Sebastian Jean Josef Robillard a.k.a. Sebastien Jean Josef Robilliard pay ASSADI PRIVATE CAPITAL, INC. \$5000.00, as follows:
  - a. 11 equal payments of \$420.00 on the 1st of each month, from March 1, 2024 to January 1, 2025,
  - b. Final payment of \$380.00 on February 1, 2025, and
  - c. by 12 post-dated cheques payable to Assadi Private Capital, Inc.
3. The respondent will mail or deliver all 12 cheques to Borden Ladner Gervais LLP, 1200-200 Burrard St., Vancouver, BC V7X 1T2, by 4:00 p.m. on February 29, 2024.
